What is Title I?

- Title I is a federal program that provides all children significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps.
- Title I provides schools with additional funds to support instruction through staffing, classroom resources, parental involvement activities and professional development.
- Census data determines which schools are designated for Title I funds.





Title I Funds – Schoolwide Programs

- Schools enrolling at least 40% of students from low-income families are eligible to use Title I funds for schoolwide programs that are designed to upgrade their entire educational programs for all students, particularly the lowest-achieving students.
- RCPS has 19 Title I schools that operate schoolwide programs.
- Title I funds can be used for supplemental staff positions such as Teaching Assistants, Instructional Assistants, Instructional Coaches, and Reading Specialists.
- Title I funds can be used for supplemental classroom resources and technology.

Schoolwide Plan

- All Title I schools develop schoolwide plans that contain instructional strategies the schools intend to use to strengthen their academic programs, increase the amount and quality of learning time, and help provide an enriched and accelerated curriculum.
- Title I schools use data to align curriculum to state and district academic standards.
- Instructional practices are adjusted based on results of assessment data.

Parent & Family Engagement

- Each Title I school must have a School-Parent and Family
 Engagement Policy that ensures effective involvement of parents
 and to support a partnership between the school, parents, and the
 community to improve student academic achievement.
- Each Title I school must have a School-Parent-Student Compact.
 The compact outlines how parents, the entire school staff, and
 students will share the responsibility for improved student
 academic achievement.
- Parent & Family Engagement events will be held throughout the year to help families provide academic and social/emotional support to their students at home.

Parents' Right To Know


- Parents of children attending a Title I school have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of their child's teachers and paraprofessionals.
- Parents of children attending a Title I school must be notified if their child is assigned a teacher for four or more consecutive weeks who does not meet certification or licensure requirements.
- Parents of children attending a Title I school may request information about any state or division policy regarding student participation in required assessments.

Parents' Right To Know

- Parents are required to be notified annually regarding their child's placement in a language instruction education program.
 Notification must occur within 30 days after the beginning of the school year, or within two weeks of the child's placement within a program.
- Parents can access their child's school's School Quality Profile on VDOE's website. See next slides for instructions.
